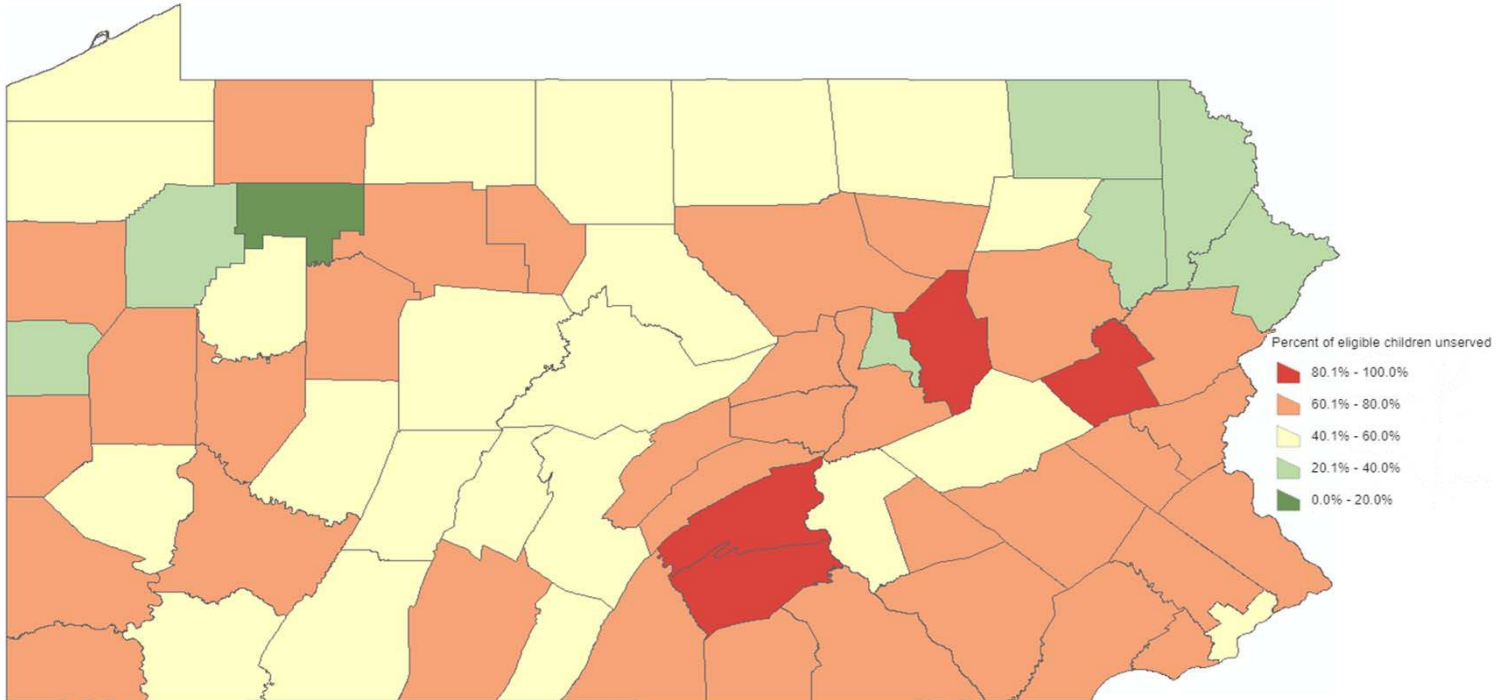


IMPORTANCE OF HIGH-QUALITY, PUBLICLY FUNDED PRE-K Pennsylvania

61% of eligible children do not have access
