In this county: 399 pre-k locations are eligible* to participate, 361 high-quality providers participate, and 702 additional pre-k classrooms are needed.

*Eligible, high-quality providers include Head Start, Keystone STARS 3 and 4 center and group child care, PDE-licensed nursery schools and school districts. Children served data includes those enrolled in high-quality providers using public funds to support their pre-k education.



The Pre-K for PA vision is to ensure that all children can enter school ready to succeed by making high-quality pre-kindergarten accessible to every three- and four-year-old in Pennsylvania.

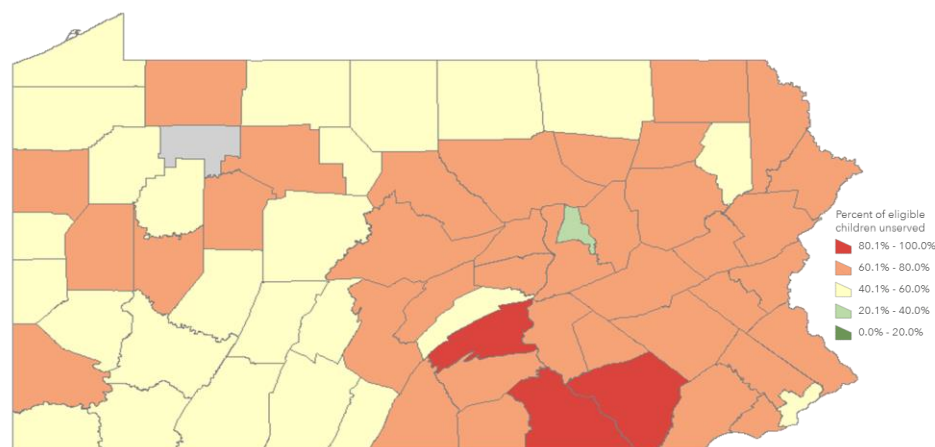

In Pennsylvania: 2,993 pre-k locations are eligible* to participate, 2,185 high-quality providers participate, and 5,336 additional pre-k classrooms are needed.

This information is based on 2020 data and reflects the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the pre-k sector.

The Pre-K for PA campaign asks state policymakers to:

- Increase high-quality pre-k line items by \$30 million to serve 3,271 new children (\$25 million in Pre-K Counts to serve 2,800 children and \$5 million in the Head Start Supplemental Assistance Program to serve 471).
- Maintain the rate increase provided to Pre-K Counts and Head Start Supplemental Assistance Programs in FY 2020-21, which supports pandemic-related costs such as PPE and cleaning supplies.
