Methodology: The Economy League of Greater Philadelphia commissioned a question in Susquehanna Polling and Research's Fall Statewide Omnibus Poll. Completed interviews were conducted October 4-9, 2014 with 700 registered voters in Pennsylvania who have prior vote history in 1 of 4 or better in G12, G11, G10 and/or G09, as well as new registered voters since 2011. Interviews are randomly selected and conducted via telephone using the professionally-trained survey research staff (live agents) from the Harrisburg telephone call center of Susquehanna Polling and Research. Interviews are closely monitored to ensure a representative sample of Pennsylvania's electorate is achieved based on party, geography, gender, age and other demographics; results are sometimes statistically weighted.

The margin of error for a sample size of 700 is +/-3.7% at the 95% confidence level.
